

Chad was born December 15, 1973 to Ken and Teresa Haynes in Asheville, NC. He spent his early childhood years in Black Mountain where the majority of his family grew up. After spending three years in Roanoke, VA, Chad and his family returned to North Carolina and settled in Weaverville. Chad built many lasting friendships starting in the eighth grade at North Buncombe Middle School, which carried into high school.

Chad attended North Buncombe High School from 1988-1992 where he proved to be an excellent student-athlete. He took mostly honors and college preparatory classes in which he carried a 3.5 grade point average. Besides his academic accomplishments, Chad was also vice president of his class and an active member in the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. Chad also participated in football, basketball and baseball and was a two-year starter in each sport. He was an all-conference performer in the outfield on an exceptional baseball team that made it to the state playoffs. He was also an all-conference guard in basketball, helping lead the Blackhawks to a Western Athletic Conference tournament title and into the state playoffs. The strong relationships Chad formed while playing high school sports continued for more than 10 years after graduating from North Buncombe High School. Chad always knew the locations of his friends and their career paths even though life was pulling everyone in different directions.

Upon graduation from high school, Chad decided to attend North Carolina State University. Even though Chad would not be a college athlete at NC State, his love for sports grew even stronger being connected with a Division I university in the reputable ACC Conference. After searching for something interesting to do during his free time, he found his calling, Intramural-Recreational Sports. He worked for the Intramural-Recreational Sports Department at NC State as an official for flag football, basketball, and softball.

Because he was such a good official, communicator and leader, Chad was promoted to an Intramural Sports Supervisor position. In Chad's senior year, a position was offered to serve as a Coordinator of Intramural Sports Officials, an opportunity with responsibility commensurate of a graduate student. As a Coordinator of Officials, he was responsible for training, scheduling and evaluating approximately 100 officials in three sports. He also participated in intramural sports and won several campus championships in flag football, basketball and softball. He took part in the National Collegiate Flag Football Championships in New Orleans as a reward for being the champion at North Carolina State University in 1995. In 1997, his senior year, Chad received the prestigious and highest honor associated with Intramural-Recreational Sports- the John F. Miller award. This award, named after the first Intramural Sports Director in the state of North Carolina, is awarded to a student for outstanding leadership, commitment and service to Intramural-Recreational Sports over a four-year period. The following month, Chad received his Bachelor of Science Degree in Textile Management from North Carolina State University.

Although Chad lived in Charlotte, Atlanta, Asheville, Raleigh, and eventually Greensboro since graduating, he always made time for his friends and family. Whether organizing the food at the home football tailgate or organizing the family golf outing or just getting old friends together over the holidays back home, Chad was always involved making sure people that cared about each other got together as often as possible. He went out of his way for his parents, sister, Trina, and his wonderful niece Mya Allen who often talks about him. This was evident on fall Saturdays with his beloved Wolfpack, Chad always made sure his family had tickets and accommodations for football games. Chad never worried about his happiness as much as the happiness of others, because if everyone was together, Chad was HAPPY.

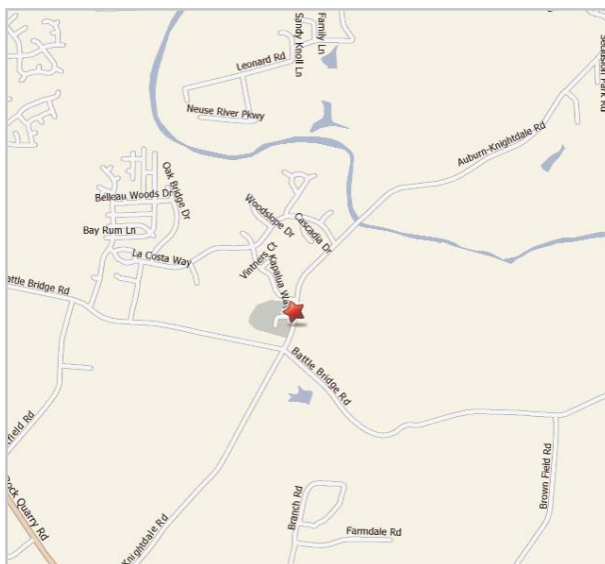
